POULTRY TESTING

Birds exhibited at the County Fair in the Southwind Extension District that originate from Kansas do not need to be tested before the fair until 2027. Birds will then be tested every 5 years. Now, if your bird comes from out of state you will be required to test within 90 days of the fair.

WRITING THANK YOU NOTES TO FAIR SPONSORS

It is very important 4-H members write and mail thank you notes to fair sponsors and livestock buyers. Please make sure you take time to send a simple note of thanks to each sponsor that has awarded you with funds, trophies, banners or plaques. Livestock buyers also appreciate it when you send them a thank you after the sale is over and/or take your baked items and gift baskets to their business the following week rather than during the livestock sale.

STATE SHOW LIVESTOCK ENTRIES

Exhibitors must submit an official entry and pay the entry fees directly through each state show in which they would like to participate. This includes entries for state nominated market animals and commercial breeding females, as well as registered breeding females. A complete nomination does NOT constitute show entry. It only makes animals eligible to subsequently be entered and exhibited in each state show a 4-H or FFA member would like to participate. The Kansas State Fair Grand Drive entries will be available once nominations close. The link to entry will be available on the Grand Drive and KJLS websites, as well as their social media platforms. Typically, Grand Drive entries open around July 1. Kansas State Fair Grand Drive entries will be due July 15, with KJLS entries due August 15. Animals that are nominated, but exhibitors do not follow the appropriate entry processes set forth by each show and pay their entry fees, will not be permitted to show. Each show manages their own rules and entries. Families will log in and submit their show entries using the same exhibitor accounts they used for state nominations – including exhibitor name and password. The tag number of each market animal or commercial breeding female an exhibitor would like to enter will be selected as a "validation number" from a list of nominated animals. All entries should be submitted under an exhibitor's name. For nomination questions, please contact Lexie Hayes at adhayes@ksu.edu. 2024 KANSAS 4-H WHEAT EXPO

Join us for the 2024 Kansas 4-H Wheat Expo on Monday, August 12th in Pottorf Hall at Cico Park in Manhattan, KS. We are excited to provide a fun, educational and hands-on program for all. You do not have to be enrolled in crops/plant science projects to participate. The Kansas 4-H State Wheat Expo is a wheat fun day showcasing all things wheat. Lunch and refreshments are sponsored, and tours will be available. Tours include the Kansas Wheat Innovation Center and the Hal Ross Flour Mill. Eight contests are open to youth members with cash prizes and ribbons awarded. Classes include: (1) 1 lb. bin run for crops members; or (2) 1 lb. bin run for "adopt a producer"; (All wheat samples must be postmarked to KSU by July 20 so testing can be completed). Youth may bring multiple exhibits in Divisions 3-9. A maximum of two placings per individual in each division, 1-8 will be awarded. (3) 1-quart jar sample of cleaned wheat; (4) three standard yeast rolls; (5) three standard-sized cookies; (6) three standard muffins; (7) wheat photography contest; (8) wheat educational posters and (9) Cloverbuds, (5-6-yearolds) with participation ribbons. The cost will be \$10 per person and registration will open online June 1. Pre-registration is required by July 25 Here. NEOSHO COUNTY FAVORITE FOODS SHOW

You will have an opportunity to participate in this during the foods judging at the fair. The Favorite Foods Show was developed to help 4-H members learn valuable skills in table setting, planning a menu, and food preparation. It is important for participants to identify a theme, a menu that compliments the theme, and a favorite food item from the menu selected. This can truly be anything. The item could be a snack, dessert, soup, salad, drink, side, or an entrée.

Prior to foods judging, please do the following:

- * Practice preparing your favorite food
- * Practice serving your favorite food
- * Understand the nutritional value of your favorite food and if there is a way to make it healthier
- * Select the table service and dishes
- * Practice setting up your table to be attractive and proper for your favorite food. This can be formal or informal (paper plates are acceptable as long as the setting is informal).

Items needed for the Favorite Food Show:

- * Card table (we will not provide them)
- * Proper table setting for one (the judge)
- * Menu
- * Recipe card for favorite food
- * Sample of your favorite food for one to be on display (judge will not sample due to the potential of safety concerns)
- * Anything else you might need

This event is a conference style judging, it is important for participants to be knowledgeable about each aspect of the display. Participation helps youth learn valuable skills they can use for a lifetime with menu planning and table setting.
