HORSE PROJECT INFORMATION

Each year, there is required paperwork each 4-H'er must have on each horse they plan to exhibit at a 4-H Horse Show. Paperwork required is the Horse ID certificate and proof of negative Coggins test certificate (within the last 12 months). The Horse ID Certificate is due to your local Extension Office by June 1. An Extension Agent will sign the certificate and make a copy of it to have on hand in the office. The negative Coggins Test certificate will need to be on hand along with your Horse ID Certificate at the day of check-in at the 4-H Horse Show. POULTRY INFORMATION

Birds exhibited at the county fair in the Southwind District that originate from Kansas do not need to be tested before the fair until 2027. Birds will then be tested every 5 years. Now, if your bird comes from out of state you will be required to text within 90 days of the fair or show proof of clean flock certificate.
