## 2024 STATE 4-H HORTICULTURE JUDGING CONTEST

The State 4-H Horticulture Judging Contest will be held on Saturday, August 10, 2024, in Manhattan, Kansas. Our contest is hosted for the day by the Department of Horticulture and Natural Resources. Intermediates must be 9 thru 13 before January 1 of the current year. Seniors must be 14 thru 18 before January 1 of the current year. The objective of 4-H Horticulture Judging is for members to grow in their ability to think, to reason, and to make logical and scientific judgments, through plant identification, knowledge testing and judging classes. ### RECORD BOOKS/KANSAS AWARD PORTFOLIO (KAP)

As soon as the County Fair ends, it is a good time to begin working on Record Books. If you need help completing these books or are completely new to the process, please let Jennifer, know. Record Books are due to your club leaders at their specific deadline to have plenty of time to review books before they are due to the Extension Office Tuesday, October 1. Books that are turned in after the deadline of your club leader will not be judged for county-wide awards. All 4-H records must be in your local Extension Office by Tuesday, October 1, 2024.

### **ENROLLMENT DEADLINE**

4-H Enrollment opens Tuesday, October 1, 2024. Enrollment and payment must be complete by December 1, 2024. **4-H Youth age 18.** If you plan to participate as a 4-H member you will need to enroll as youth. If you plan to be a 4-H volunteer only, please enroll as an adult.

### KANSAS 4-H YOUTH LEADERSHIP COUNCIL

The Youth Council and National 4-H Conference application will be combined, with applicants indicating if they are applying for one or both opportunities. Kansas 4-H members between the ages of 14 and 18 before January 1, 2025 may apply as a Council Rep and those age 15-18 before January 1, 2025 may apply for National Conference. This year's KYLF delegation will elect representatives from the four extension program regions (NE, NW, SE, SW) for one year terms on council. Up to six National Conference delegates will be selected through an interview process at KYLF and they serve a two-year term on council. The application deadline is Tuesday, October 1, 2024, 11:59 p.m. CST



# **NATIONAL 4-H CONFERENCE**

Secretary of Agriculture, assist in the development of recommendations to help guide 4-H Youth Development programs nationally and in their communities. This event brings together youth, volunteer leaders, and state and county Extension Staff members from across the United States, the U.S. Territories, and the Canadian Providences. Check out the video for highlights Here The event provides youth the opportunity to acquire practical knowledge and skills to reinforce the attitudes and motivation that will give them a heightened sense of responsibility and capacity to connect with others as active member of society. Youth will engage in educational activities to explore, practice and master civic engagement skills and personal development to make a difference in their community, country and world. Any 4-H youth member program age 15-18 may apply for the opportunity to attend National 4-H Conference in Washington D.C. area. The event is typically scheduled for April in Arlington, Virginia. Applications are due Monday, October 1, 2024, local Extension Units may require an earlier deadline for their families. Applicants are screened and top applicants will be invited for interview. Up to six Kansas youth may be selected to attend this event. One or two adult chaperones will also be selected to accompany the delegation. Chaperones must be at least 21 years old and must be a registered volunteer. Interested adult volunteers and Extension Staff should contact Beth Hinshaw or Dona Ratliff. Cost to attend is approximately \$2000. 4-H clubs, 4-H councils, local 4-H Foundations and local service groups have helped many delegates with this fee. Additional conference fees are sponsored by the Kansas 4-H Foundation and their generous donors. This link will take you to the 2023 Evaluation.
